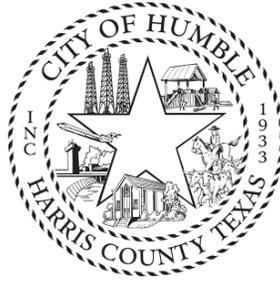



Council Member Funderburk offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Upon a motion made by Council Member Funderburk, the City Council voted six (6) for and none (0) opposed to approve the Consent Agenda.

- 3. **APPROVAL OF DEVELOPMENT PLAT FOR TOWNSEN LANDING VILLAGE – SECTION 1, A SUBDIVISION OF 18.903 ACRES OF LAND LOCATED IN THE WHERRY B. ADAMS SURVEY, A-95 CITY OF HUMBLE, HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS’ 1 BLOCK, 1 RESERVE.**

City Manager Boeske asked for approval noting that it meets all of the city’s specifications. Mayor Aaron said that he believed it was the most complete set of plans he had ever seen and thanked the developer.

Upon a motion made by Council Member Steagall, the City Council voted six (6) for and none (0) opposed to approve the Development Plat.

- 4. **APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 2 FOR THE 2015 CONCRETE PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT – PACKAGE 1 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$121,123.20 PAYABLE TO METRO CITY CONSTRUCTION, L.P. FOR THE INCLUSION OF THE REHABILITATION OF THE FIRST STREET SANITARY SEWER LINE FROM AVENUE C TO HOUSTON AVENUE.**

City Manager Boeske asked for approval saying that this will keep the city in front of the road project on First Street that is currently headed up by TxDOT.

Council Member Pierce asked why the Changer Order was necessary. City Manager Boeske stated that the First Street work is being contracted by TxDOT but that the city was responsible for moving the utilities; rather than going out for another contract it was in the best interest of the city to issue a change order to our existing contract with Metro City Construction.

Upon a motion made by Council Member Curry, the City Council voted six (6) for and none (0) opposed to approve Changer Order #2 in the amount of \$121,123.20.

There being no further business before the City Council, Mayor Aaron adjourned the Regular Meeting of the City Council at 6:35 P.M. on Thursday, June 25, 2015.



Governor's Vetoes Include City-Related Bills

Governor Greg Abbott has vetoed 42 bills passed by the legislature during the regular session. Ten of the 42 were city-related bills described in the League's "wrap-up" [Legislative Update](#) on June 5. (Both the PDF and online version of that edition have been updated to reflect vetoed bills and other minor corrections.) Those 10 vetoes are detailed below:

- **H.B. 2282 (Guillen/Uresti) – Property Tax Protests:** provides, among other things, that an appraisal review board and chief appraiser must review the evidence or arguments provided by a property owner before a hearing on a protest.

According to the governor's veto message, "[t]he Texas Tax Code allows all property owners in Texas to bring an appeal in district court to challenge an appraisal district decision regarding their property. These appeals are important matters for property owners, who deserve a fair and predictable process by which to challenge the actions of appraisal districts. House Bill 2282 departs from the uniform, statewide rules governing appraisal appeals by allowing property owners in just one of the state's 254 counties to file their appeals with a justice of the peace instead of a district court. Unlike district courts, justices of the peace generally do not serve an entire county; instead they serve a particular geographic district within the county. Yet House Bill 2282 would allow property owners to choose any justice of the peace in the county to hear their appeal. This would invite forum shopping and would allow a justice of the peace to make rulings about property in a part of the county he or she does not represent."

- **H.B. 2775 (E. Rodriguez/Zaffirini) – Candidate Applications:** provides that: (1) a single notarized affidavit by any person who obtains signatures for a candidate petition is valid for all signatures gathered by the person, if the date of notarization is after the date of the last signature obtained by the person; and (2) a candidate petition may be corrected and additional signatures presented after the petition has been initially filed, but not after the deadline for filing the petition.

According to the governor’s veto message, “[t]he Election Code requires those seeking a place on the ballot for certain races to submit to the Secretary of State a petition containing signatures of registered voters who support the candidacy. House Bill 2775 would allow candidates who submit deficient petitions to update their petitions in a piecemeal fashion, rather than requiring the submission of a single, legally compliant petition. This could increase the risk of erroneous or fraudulent petitions. To the extent there are concerns about the Secretary of State’s current policies on candidate petitions, the Legislature should work with the Secretary of State’s office to address this issue in the next session.”

- **H.B. 2788 (Springer/Perry) – Conservation Measures:** allows a retail public utility, which includes a municipally owned utility, to require the operator of a correctional facility that receives water or sewer service from the utility to comply with water conservation measures adopted by the utility.

According to the governor’s veto message, “Texas’ prison system and the many county-level correctional facilities across the state should seek to conserve water whenever doing so is consistent with their core purpose – the secure and lawful incarceration of inmates. While water conservation is a worthy goal, House Bill 2788 goes too far by subjecting prisons and jails to the conservation mandates of local water utilities that do not share the correctional facilities’ penological mission. Ceding control of the state’s correctional facilities’ water use to local water utilities creates the potential for interference with a core function of government. If the legislature wishes to require prisons and jails to use less water, it should do so directly rather than outsourcing the decision to local water utilities. Moreover, this bill would mandate unfunded costs on state and local correctional facilities. Any savings touted through reduced water consumption can, and should, be realized today through prudent water conservation measures that are not driven by regulation.”

- **H.B. 3060 (Anchia/West) – Building and Standards Commission:** provides that, in addition to the authority in current law, a panel of a building and standards commission may order action to be taken as necessary to remedy, alleviate, remove, or abate, violations of ordinances relating to animal care/control or water conservation measures (including water restrictions).

According to the governor’s veto message, “[l]ocal governments generally should have flexibility to respond to local concerns, including the need to conserve water. House Bill

3060 goes too far, however, by granting broad authority to local enforcement commissions to interfere with private property rights. Lawn-watering restrictions can already be enforced by fines. The additional enforcement authority provided by this bill would allow the government to insert itself too deeply into what a private property owner chooses to do on his or her own land. Local governments already have sufficient tools at their disposal to encourage their residents to use less water.

- **H.B. 3184 (McClendon/Menendez) – Victim-Offender Mediation Program:** authorizes a city council: (1) to establish a pretrial victim-offender mediation program for persons charged with a misdemeanor or state jail felony offense against property; (2) to adopt administrative and local rules of procedure for the program; and (3) to collect from a participant a \$500 fee for the program and \$15 court cost paid to the municipal treasury for the purpose of funding the program.

According to the governor’s veto message, “[m]ediation is a process available in civil lawsuits by which parties can work out their disputes without using courts. House Bill 3184 imports the civil law process of mediation into criminal law, allowing for mediation between the victim of the crime and the criminal to take the place of prosecution by the State, even in some violent felony cases. This "victim-offender mediation" leaves out a key party in criminal litigation-the State of Texas. Criminal indictments in Texas allege that a crime has been committed "against the peace and dignity of the State." The State, not the victim of crime, brings criminal litigation against the defendant. And while prosecutors do seek justice for victims, their primary duty is to represent the broader public interest in deterring and punishing crime for the good of all Texans. Making amends with the victim of a crime does not absolve the criminal of his legal debt to the State. Mediation is not well-suited to the criminal context and should be reserved for civil cases.”

- **H.B. 3511 (Davis/Huffman) – Financial Statements:** requires that financial statements filed by officials and candidates in cities with a population of 100,000 or greater contain information about certain community and separate property, and that the statements meet certain requirements if they are electronically filed.

According to the governor’s veto message, “Texans deserve accountability and transparency from their public officials. House Bill 3511 weakens the ethics laws governing officeholder financial disclosures. I cannot allow that.”

- **H.B. 3579 (Alonzo/Rodriguez) – Expunction of Records:** provides that: (1) a person who is convicted of and has satisfied the judgment for, or who has received a dismissal after deferral of disposition for, a fine-only misdemeanor, other than an offense under the Transportation Code or municipal ordinance, may petition the court for an order of nondisclosure; (2) the court shall hold a hearing on whether the person is entitled to file the petition and whether issuance of the order is in the best interest of justice; and (3) the clerk of a court that collects a fee for the petition shall deposit the fee to the credit of the general fund of the city.

According to the governor's veto message, "I previously signed Senate Bill 1902, which increases the ability of those who have been convicted of misdemeanors to have their criminal records sealed from public disclosure. The purpose of that legislation is to expand the employment prospects of individuals whose minor criminal records may be unduly limiting their ability to pursue an honest living.

House Bill 3579 has a similar goal, but it goes too far by allowing courts to expunge dismissed criminal charges – including serious felony charges – even when the defendant was convicted of other, related charges. This would be problematic for two reasons. First, dismissal of a criminal charge is not necessarily an indicator of the defendant's innocence of that crime, particularly when a multi-charge arrest results in a plea agreement. Second, unlike orders of non-disclosure, which seal records from public view, expunction seals the records even from law enforcement. Under House Bill 3579, even those convicted of serious felonies could have parts of their criminal record expunged. This would deprive law enforcement of information about the offense history of habitual criminals, which may be useful in the investigation of future crimes."

- **H.B. 4103 (Guillen/Garcia) – Judges:** provides that a municipal judge who continues to serve because the city council failed to take action to remove or reappoint the judge as required by law may continue to perform the duties of the office without taking an additional oath of office.

According to the governor's veto message, "[t]he Texas Constitution requires all elected or appointed officers to take the following oath: "I, do solemnly swear (or affirm), that I will faithfully execute the duties of the office of the State of Texas, and will to the best of my ability preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States and of this State, so help me God." The oath is commonly re-taken when an existing officeholder begins a new term. House Bill 4103 would exempt municipal judges from the need to take the oath for a subsequent term of office. Judges, of all offices, should never be excused from the obligation to swear to preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution."

- **S.B. 1034 (Rodriguez/Miller) – Voting by Mail:** provides that: (1) when a voter cancels an application for a ballot by mail, the cancellation does not extend to a subsequent election; (2) a person eligible to submit an application for a ballot to be voted by mail on the grounds of age or disability may apply to receive all ballots in an even numbered year on the same application submitted for a ballot in the November general election of an odd year; and (3) the secretary of state by rule may redesign the official carrier envelope by moving all the textual material to a separate sheet and styling the signature box to insure that a voter is instructed to and must sign over the flap.

According to the governor's veto message, "[t]he integrity of the vote-by-mail process must be strengthened, not called into question. Amendments added to Senate Bill 1034 late in the legislative process would create confusion as to how counties should

administer mail-in ballot applications. To ensure this important matter is addressed with the clarity it deserves, the Legislature should reconsider the issue and eliminate the uncertainty and ambiguity contained in this bill.”

- **S.B. 1408 (Lucio/T. King) – Community Development Grant Program:** provides that: (1) the Texas Department of Agriculture, subject to the availability of funds, must create a community development matching grant program to assist in financing various activities, including trade-related initiatives, renewable energy projects, water or wastewater infrastructure projects, and economic development projects; and (2) a city is eligible for a matching grant if the city is in a nonentitlement area as defined under the federal community development block grant nonentitlement program and in good standing with the department and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

According to the governor’s veto message, “Senate Bill 1408 creates new authorities to issue state funds to local units of governments similar to, and in some cases identical to, grants already made under the federal Community Development Block Grant program. The stated intent of the new programs is to offset reductions in federal funding with new state funding. Our federal government's addiction to spending Texas taxpayer dollars must be brought under control, and when it is, the State of Texas should not find ways to tax our citizens to continue funding services our federal elected officials have deemed worthy of curtailing.”

U.S. Supreme Court Further Restricts Municipal Sign Regulations

On June 18, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its opinion in [*Reed v. Town of Gilbert*](#). The opinion follows a continuing judicial trend of limiting municipal regulations governing signs and billboards. The opinion concludes that ordinance provisions containing content-based restrictions are likely unconstitutional.

The Town of Gilbert, Arizona, enacted a sign ordinance that defined various types of signs and restricted the different types of signs in different ways. For example, the ordinance included definitions for temporary directional signs, ideological signs, and political signs. Based on the type of sign, it then limited how long the sign could be posted. (Temporary directional signs could be posted no sooner than 12 hours before an event and for one hour after the event, but ideological or political signs could be posted for much longer.)

A church in the town regularly changed the location of its services. Each week, the church used temporary directional signs to guide parishioners to the appropriate location. The signs were in place longer than allowed by the town’s ordinance, and the town cited the church for the violations.

The church sued the town, arguing that the shortened time frame for temporary directional signs versus the longer time frame for ideological and other signs was a “content-based” restriction on speech that is prohibited by the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. The town countered that the shorter time frame for temporary directional signs was not content-based because anyone’s temporary directional sign had to follow the same restrictions, not just churches.

The Court held that the ordinance’s varying durations for posting based on the type of sign was based on the content of the sign because a city employee had to read the sign to enforce the ordinance. When a restriction on speech is content-based (as opposed to a reasonable time, place, or manner restriction,) it will be upheld only if a city can show that the restriction is “narrowly-tailored to meet a compelling governmental interest.” That test is referred to by the courts as “strict scrutiny.” A law or ordinance that is subject to strict scrutiny rarely survives a first amendment analysis.

The Court invalidated the ordinance because the town did not prove that the content-based distinction was narrowly tailored to achieve the town’s interests of aesthetics and traffic safety. As support for its position, the court noted that the ordinance allowed a great number of signs to be placed for long periods of time. That fact, in-and-of-itself, refuted the town’s stated interests of aesthetics and traffic safety. Moreover, the court concluded that the various exceptions in the ordinance for certain signs made the restriction of other signs insupportable.

As a practical matter, the opinion means that any provision in a sign ordinance requiring a city employee to read a sign before deciding whether it is in compliance subjects the ordinance to the strict scrutiny test. That heightened review affects every city’s ability to restrict political signs and could even affect a city’s ability to restrict offsite signs, like billboards, differently than onsite signs. More troubling is that restrictions based on the commercial versus non-commercial messages on a sign could be affected.

An ordinance can arguably still prohibit all signs on city property, including city rights-of-way, and can limit the size, building materials, and other aesthetic aspects of a sign. For example, a city could still ban all billboard-sized signs, but it would have a harder time allowing some billboards and not others if a differentiation is based on the content of the billboard.

Each city should review its sign ordinance in light of this opinion. If the ordinance contains any content-based restrictions, the city should ensure that they are narrowly tailored to meet the city’s compelling governmental interests. TxDOT Unveils Local Project Toolkit

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is currently working with more than 200 local governments on more than 900 active local government (LG) projects. Those projects include: (1) signal timing upgrades on urban streets; (2) hike and bike trails; (3) adding

sidewalks near elementary schools; (4) adding managed lanes to an urban freeway; and (5) performing access-management studies.

Developing those local transportation projects in conformance with the numerous laws and regulations applicable to the projects can be complex and time-consuming. In an effort to facilitate development processes for local governments that use state or federal funding for local transportation projects, TxDOT has created an online toolkit designed to simplify the required steps of project development.

The heart of the toolkit is a [web portal](#) that leads project personnel to the point in the development process where they are currently working. From this point, they can link directly to a new “LG Projects Policy Manual, the new LG Project Management Guide, and the new LG Project Workbook.”

Each of those resources serves a unique purpose: (1) the policy manual includes laws, regulations, and policies that define why a local government must take a certain action; (2) the management guide includes procedures explaining what action each agency must perform; and (3) the workbook includes checklists, forms, and other tools representing best practices on how to successfully perform each action. Each of the documents has direct links to applicable federal and state laws and regulations, internal/external websites and online manuals, and internal/external forms and tools.

Rather than needing to know where to find applicable sections of the federal law, state law, TxDOT policy, and available tools and forms, this new online toolkit allows every person involved in an LG project to navigate directly to anything needed to those items.

Resolutions for the 2015 TML Annual Conference

The legislative efforts of TML are guided by its members. That guidance comes in the form of resolutions that are submitted by member cities, TML regions, TML affiliates, and TML committees. If your city has a legislative issue that it would like TML to consider, please submit it in accordance with the following instructions.

The TML Constitution states that resolutions for consideration at the Annual Conference must be submitted to the TML headquarters 45 calendar days prior to the first day of the Annual Conference. For 2015, this provision means that resolutions from any member city, TML region, or TML affiliate must arrive at the TML headquarters no later than 5:00 p.m. on **August 10, 2015**.

The TML Board of Directors has adopted several procedures governing the resolutions process. Please review the following items carefully and thoroughly.

1. No resolution may be considered by the TML Resolutions Committee unless it has prior approval of: (a) the governing body of a TML member

city; (b) the governing body or membership of a TML affiliate, or (c) the membership of a TML region at a regional meeting.

2. TML member cities, regions, and affiliates that wish to submit a resolution **must** complete a resolution cover sheet. The cover sheet is available [here](#). Please feel free to make as many copies of this cover sheet as you desire. The cover sheet must be attached to the resolution throughout each step of the resolutions process.
3. It is recommended that any resolution state one of four categories to better direct League staff. Those categories are:
 - **Seek Introduction and Passage** means that the League will attempt to find a sponsor, will provide testimony, and will otherwise actively pursue passage. Bills in this category are known as “TML bills.”
 - **Support** means the League will attempt to obtain passage of the initiative if it is introduced by a city or some other entity.
 - **Oppose.**
 - **Take No Position.**

4. Resolutions submitted will be thoroughly discussed at the TML Annual Conference. The Resolutions Committee is appointed by the TML President and is made up of city officials from TML member cities across the state.
5. The city, region, or affiliate that submits a resolution is encouraged to send a representative to the Resolutions Committee meeting to explain the resolution. The Resolutions Committee will meet at **2:00 p.m.** on **Tuesday, September 22, 2015**, at the **Henry B. Gonzalez Center in San Antonio**.

If the procedures described above are not followed for any given resolution, that resolution is likely to be referred to some other TML committee for further study. In that case, the resolution would not be adopted during the 2015 conference.

Local Sales Tax Bill Gives Cities Increased Financial Flexibility

On June 20, Governor Abbott signed [H.B. 157](#) (Larson/Eltife) into law. The bill authorizes a city to hold an election to *reallocate sales tax revenue*. By doing so, it allows a city to determine whether dedicated sales taxes should be increased or decreased, or whether a general revenue sales tax better serves its needs. (The bill does not allow an increase above the two percent local cap. It authorizes reallocation by election within a percentage that is below that cap.)

More specifically, the bill provides that: (1) a city may hold an election to impose a dedicated sales and use tax for sports and venue districts, crime control and prevention districts, economic development corporations, property tax relief, or street maintenance at any rate that is an increment of at least one-eighth of one percent and that would not result in a combined rate that exceeds the maximum local sales and use tax rate of two percent; and (2) a city may hold an election to impose its general sales and use tax at any rate that is an increment of at least one-eighth of one percent and that would not result in a combined rate that exceeded the maximum local sales and use tax rate of two percent.

The state's sales tax rate is 6.25 percent. Cities, counties, and some special purpose districts may impose sales taxes up to an additional two percent. The total sales tax rate can't exceed 8.25 percent in any area. House Bill 157 leaves all of those limits in place, but it authorizes a city to hold an election to *reallocate sales tax revenue within the two percent local sales tax cap*. In a nutshell, the bill allows a city to assess its funding priorities and reallocate the distribution of its general and dedicated sales taxes, so long as the total local tax rate does not exceed two percent.

When the legislature authorized cities to adopt a general revenue sales tax in 1967, it provided that the rate of the general revenue sales tax must be set at one percent—no higher and no lower. House Bill 157 changes that. When the bill becomes effective on September 1, cities will be able to call an election to increase or decrease their general sales tax rate in any increment of one-eighth of one percent.

House Bill 157 also gives cities the ability to adjust the rates of some of their dedicated sales taxes. In contrast to the general revenue sales tax, the revenue from which can be used for almost any purpose, cities also are authorized to hold elections to adopt sales taxes that may only be used for specific, dedicated purposes. Under current law, these dedicated sales taxes are capped at certain amounts. For instance, an economic development corporation sales tax may not exceed one-half of one percent. Similarly, the street maintenance sales tax may not exceed one-fourth of one percent. House Bill 157 essentially removes the current caps on the dedicated sales taxes for venue districts, crime control and prevention districts, economic development corporations, property tax relief, and street maintenance, and authorizes a city to hold an election to increase or decrease these dedicated sales taxes in any increment of one-eighth of one percent.

How might the bill benefit your city? Let's say a city currently has a general revenue sales tax of one percent, a Type B economic development corporation sales tax of one-half of one percent, a street maintenance sales tax of one-fourth of one percent, and a sales tax for property tax relief of one-fourth of one percent. That's a combined sales tax rate of 8.25 percent (6.25 percent for the state, and 2 percent for the city). When the bill becomes effective, the city could call a special election to reallocate all of those city sales taxes in a way that might make more financial sense. The city may wish to hold an election, for instance, to have the entire two percent go towards general revenue and repeal all other dedicated sales taxes. Alternatively, the city could have an election to have one percent go towards general revenue, and the remaining one percent going to property tax relief. Or the city could have a ballot proposition to repeal the street maintenance sales tax and have the one-fourth of one percent be dedicated towards the economic development corporation.

(Note that H.B. 157 gives cities the ability to hold an election to reallocate or adopt *city* sales taxes. Local sales taxes that have been adopted by other local governments that have overlapping jurisdiction with a city cannot be repealed or reallocated by city action.)

House Bill 157 passed both houses of the Texas Legislature with very little fanfare and minimal opposition. Despite the relative lack of attention paid to it throughout the session, it will likely be considered as one of the most beneficial city bills in recent years.

U.S. Supreme Court Highlights: **What You Need to Know and How Your City Will be Affected**

The Texas Municipal League works closely with an organization known as the [State and Local Legal Center](#) (SLLC) to ensure that city interests are protected at the U.S. Supreme Court.

The SLLC files *amicus curiae* briefs in support of states and local governments at the Supreme Court and provides other assistance in connection with Supreme Court litigation. Since 1983, the SLLC has filed over 300 *amicus* briefs in the Supreme Court.

Lisa Soronen, the SLLC's executive director, has prepared excellent summaries of the recently-released Supreme Court opinions that affect cities. Those summaries are available [here](#) on the National League of Cities website, and include recent cases related to same-sex marriage, regulation of signs, the Affordable Care Act, the Fair Housing Act, government speech, religious accommodation, and asset forfeiture.

U.S Supreme Court's Same-Sex Marriage Opinion: **What it means for Cities**

In a 5-4 decision written by Justice Kennedy, the U.S. Supreme Court held on June 26, 2015, that same-sex couples have a constitutional right to marry. As a result of the opinion in [Obergefell v. Hodges](#), state laws and court decisions banning same-sex marriage are now invalid.

Justice Kennedy stated in the majority opinion that “[n]o union is more profound than marriage, for it embodies the highest ideals of love, fidelity, devotion, sacrifice, and family.” More specifically, the majority opinion offers four principles that demonstrate why the fundamental right to marry applies to same-sex couples. First, the right to choose who you marry is “inherent in the concept of individual autonomy.” Second, because the right to marry is “unlike any other in its importance[,]” it should not be denied to any two-person union. Third, marriage between same-sex couples safeguards children and families the same as it does for opposite-sex couples. Finally, marriage is a keystone of American social order from which no one should be excluded.

Whether a city official supports or opposes the conclusion in the opinion, it leads to a number of possible legal issues. League staff has prepared a [Q&A](#) to provide a basic framework within

which city officials, in consultation with their local legal counsel, can decide how to locally implement the opinion.

Cities and Firearms

During the 2015 Legislative Session, the Texas Legislature passed House Bill 910 and Senate Bill 11. House Bill 910 allows a license holder to “open carry” a handgun in a belt or shoulder holster beginning on January 1, 2016, and S.B. 11 allows a license holder, with exceptions, to carry a concealed handgun on a college campus beginning on August 1, 2016.

Those bills, combined with more frequent rallies and gatherings dedicated to the open carry of rifles, has led to confusion about the law in Texas. The League’s legal department has prepared a [paper](#), which includes a chart, explaining state law and municipal authority over the regulation of “firearms” (e.g., rifles, shotguns, and handguns) in Texas.

Texas Attorney General Sues EPA

This week, Texas attorney general Ken Paxton sued the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). His lawsuit seeks to overturn the EPA’s recently-released “Waters of the U.S.” rule. The rule defines which bodies of water are subject to regulation under the federal Clean Water Act.

According to the rule, “waters of the United States” means:

1. All waters that are currently used, were used in the past, or may be susceptible to use in interstate or foreign commerce, including all waters that are subject to the ebb and flow of the tide (this definition is commonly referred to as “traditional navigable waters”).
2. All interstate waters, including interstate wetlands.
3. The territorial seas.
4. All impoundments of waters otherwise identified as waters of the United States.
5. All “tributaries” of waters identified in 1-3, above.
6. All waters “adjacent” to a water identified in 1-5 above, including wetlands, ponds, lakes, oxbows, impoundments, and similar waters.
7. Prairie potholes, Carolina bays and Delmarva bays, Pocosins, western vernal pools, and Texas coastal prairie wetlands if they are determined, on a case-specific basis, to have a “significant nexus” to a water identified in 1-3 above.
8. All waters located within the 100-year floodplain of water identified in 1-3 above and all waters located within 4,000 feet of the high tide line or ordinary high water mark of a

water identified in 1-5, above, in which they are determined on a case-specific basis to have a significant nexus to a water in 1-3, above.

Paxton, who is joined by the attorneys general of the States of Louisiana and Mississippi, contends that the new rule is a “blatant overstep of federal authority” and that the EPA’s actions are inconsistent with U.S. Supreme Court precedent. He also claims that the rule is contrary to the congressional intent of the Clean Water Act and infringes on the states’ ability to regulate their own natural resources.

The rule and the lawsuit, like many water-related issues, divide city officials based on their location, natural resources, and basis for their economy. As such, the League will be limited to monitoring and reporting on further developments.

Upcoming Contract Disclosure Requirements: League Asks Texas Ethics Commission for Clarification

[House Bill 1295](#), passed during the recent legislative session, imposes new disclosure requirements on city contracts. All of the consequences for cities are currently unknown, but the League has asked the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) to address some of these issues in its impending rulemaking process.

House Bill 1295 provides that: (1) certain governmental entities, including cities, are prohibited from entering into a contract with a business entity unless the business entity submits a disclosure of interested parties (i.e., discloses a person who has a controlling interest in the business or who actively participates in facilitating the contract for the business) if the contract: (a) requires an action or vote by the governing body before the contract may be signed; or (b) the contract has a value of at least \$1 million; (2) the disclosure must be on a form prescribed by the TEC; and (3) a governmental entity must, not later than 30 days after receiving a disclosure, submit a copy to the TEC.

These new requirements apply only to city contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2016. However, the TEC is charged with adopting rules to implement the bill's requirements no later than December 1, 2015. The League has sent the TEC a letter prior to the beginning of the formal rulemaking process. The hope is that the TEC will consider the following questions prior to publishing the rules for formal comments:

- What are the consequences if a city fails to submit a copy of the disclosure to the TEC? Or fails to timely submit a copy of the disclosure to the TEC?
- Does the disclosure requirement apply to a contract that is renewed on or after January 1, 2016, but that was initially executed prior to that date?
- What does it mean to “enter into a contract” with a business entity? Does that phrase include any action that requires the signatures of all the parties to the contract (e.g., renewal of a contract, amendment of a contract)?
- Does the disclosure requirement apply when the city council has delegated authority to execute a contract to an employee such as the city manager?
- Must/may a disclosure be updated or corrected by a business entity? If so, under what circumstances and within what timeframe?
- Will the TEC publish or otherwise release a disclosure to the public? If so, will the TEC give a business entity the chance to protect any confidential or proprietary information before releasing a disclosure to the public?

Each city should consult its local legal counsel to determine how these new requirements may impact the city’s contracting and procurement process. Member cities are also urged to: (1) file comments and participate in the TEC rulemaking process (the League will publicize that comment period, which should be towards the end of 2015); and (2) communicate issues and concerns to Christy Drake-Adams, TML legal counsel, at Christy@tml.org so that she can coordinate efforts in the rulemaking process.

HUD Issues Final Fair Housing Rule

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released its final Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH) Rule. Essentially, the AFFH Rule creates additional procedures and requirements for cities that receive HUD funding, including Community Development Block Grant funds.

Adopted pursuant to the Fair Housing Act of 1968, the AFFH Rule directs HUD and its program participants (e.g., cities, public housing authorities, and others) to affirmatively further the Act’s goals of promoting fair housing and equal opportunity. HUD claims the rule “clarifies and simplifies existing fair housing obligations for HUD grantees to analyze their fair housing landscape and set locally-determined fair housing priorities and goals through an Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH).” To aid communities in this work, HUD will provide open data (such as notated maps) to grantees and the public on patterns related to low-income housing.

A city that receives HUD funding will use the data to prepare a report called an assessment of fair housing (AFH). The AFH must contain information related to disparity of access to community assets, segregation, racially-concentrated area of poverty, and disproportionate housing needs. A city will have to prepare and submit the report to HUD in order to receive funding. HUD will provide an AFH assessment tool, which consists of a series of questions

designed to help HUS fund recipients identify how best to use HUD funds to promote fair housing.

The AFFH Rule and other information are available on HUD's [website](#). The final rule adoption comes on the heels of the recent U.S. Supreme Court opinion in [Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs v. Inclusive Communities Project](#). In that opinion, the Court held that "disparate impact" claims may be brought under the Fair Housing Act. In a disparate impact case, a plaintiff does not claim that a practice is intentionally discriminatory. Instead, he claims that the practice has a disproportionately adverse impact on a protected class.

In the case, the Inclusive Communities Project (ICP) sued the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA), claiming that TDHCA's selection criteria for federal low-income tax credits in the City of Dallas had a disparate impact on minorities. Specifically, ICP claimed that TDHCA was giving too many tax credits to low-income housing in predominately black inner-city areas compared to predominately white suburban neighborhoods. The case will now continue based on the Court's ruling.

City officials may need to consult with local legal counsel relating to their affordable housing activities in light of the opinion and the AFFH Rule.

Oil and Gas Regulation Clearinghouse

The House version of the oil and gas drilling bill, [H.B. 40](#) by Rep. Drew Darby, became law on May 18, 2015, when it was signed by Governor Abbott. The final version of the bill represents a compromise between the Texas Municipal League and the Texas Oil and Gas Association.

The final version of the bill improves on the original bill in four significant ways. Specifically, it:

1. enshrines in statute a non-inclusive list of items cities can regulate, including fire and emergency response, traffic, lights, noise, notice, and reasonable setbacks. (The inclusion of setbacks is a key component because the original version of the bill likely prevented them.)
2. permits cities to regulate aboveground activity that is “related” to oil and gas operations, as opposed to activities that are “incident” to operations, as in the original version of the bill. The “incident to” language was prohibitively restrictive.
3. includes a much better definition of “commercially reasonable,” one of the tests an ordinance must meet to be valid under the bill. The final version provides that commercially reasonable is based on an objective standard instead of the subjective assessment of a particular oil and gas operator.
4. creates a “prima facie” presumption of commercial reasonableness for certain ordinances that have allowed activity for at least five years. This “safe harbor” is a rolling five-year time period that permits recent or future ordinances to qualify so long as they haven’t prevented operations for a five-year period.

Make no mistake: The bill isn’t perfect. Some areas of regulation, especially those related to subsurface activity, may be preempted. So would outright city-wide bans on oil and drilling or

fracking. But here's the essential point: *better than 80% of what most cities regulate under current ordinances is protected.*

City officials should be aware that adoption or amendment of any ordinance regulating oil and gas operations should be in conformity with H.B. 40. Likewise, the League will closely monitor the industry to ensure that the various safe harbor provisions permitted by the bill are respected by operators and their representatives. To assist cities, the League has created an "Oil and Gas Regulation" webpage at www.tml.org (Go to the Legal tab and click on the Topics drop down menu).

The page will include the pleadings in each lawsuit that has been filed, as well as additional information. The page will not include "sample" or "model" ordinances. That's because each city's needs and wants are unique, and also because the commercial reasonableness of various ordinance provisions will vary by geography and the level of drilling activity.

Thankfully, all appears quiet on the litigation front thus far. The only lawsuit pleadings on the page right now relates to the essentially moot challenge against the City of Denton's now-defunct hydraulic fracturing ban. Each city should consult with local legal counsel prior to adopting or amending any ordinance. That is particularly true in this instance.

Update: E-Cigarettes

As is often the case with novel issues impacting the public health and safety, cities preceded both the state and federal government in enacting regulations regarding electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes). City e-cigarette ordinances generally impose: (1) zoning regulations; and/or (2) health and safety regulations (e.g., they often prohibit the sale and distribution to minors). In light of impending regulations at the state and federal level, your city may soon need to revisit its existing e-cigarette regulations.

What has state government done? Senate Bill 97, passed during the recent legislative session, is by far the most significant step the State of Texas has taken on this matter. That bill includes e-cigarettes in the existing state regulations that govern the sale, distribution, possession, use, and advertising of cigarettes and other tobacco products. Though the bill is not effective until October 1, 2015, the state comptroller must make related signage available to the public by September 15, 2015. Of particular interest to cities is the bill's state law ban on the sale of e-cigarettes to minors.

The bill did not add e-cigarettes to [Section 161.089](#) of the Texas Health and Safety, a current-law provision that deals with the preemption of local laws. That section allows cities to enact regulations relating to the sale, distribution, or use of cigarettes or tobacco products if the regulation is compatible with and equal to or more stringent than a requirement prescribed by state law. Because city e-cigarette regulations are neither permitted nor prohibited by the new or existing legislation, whether a city can regulate them is unclear. Thus, each city needs to consult its local legal counsel to determine whether Senate Bill 97 preempts any of its local regulations.

Perhaps in anticipation of Senate Bill 97 becoming effective, state agencies have begun to address e-cigarettes. For instance, the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) recently proposed rules that add the use of vapor products to the TDCJ Tobacco Policy.

What has the federal government done? In 2014, the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) proposed a rule that will allow the FDA to regulate products such as e-cigarettes, nicotine gels, and other products under the Federal Tobacco Control Act. For the time being at least, the action remains at the state and local level. The League will continue to monitor this issue and report any important federal regulatory developments.

Lt. Governor Appoints Select Transportation Committee

Lt. Governor Patrick announced the appointment of the Senate Select Committee on Transportation Planning. The committee created by [H.B. 20](#) will study issues related to transportation planning, financing and performance, and the Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) collaboration with stakeholders such as elected officials, local governments, and metropolitan planning organizations. The committee is as follows:

As you will recall, the City Council adopted a resolution in April which established the Downtown Improvement Program. At that meeting the proposed program was amended to restrict the program to owner-occupied properties by imposing a three (3) year longevity proviso. At the same meeting the eligibility for commercial properties was also removed.

Since the adoption of the program, we have received a fair amount of interest in the program, however, most of the interest has been for improving commercial properties in the downtown area and to date only one eligible owner-occupied residential project has been submitted.

As such, staff is recommending that the program be expanded. Proposed in this agenda item are two options for the Council's consideration:

- Option 1: Amend the program opening it up to all residential properties by removing the three (3) year longevity period.
- Option 2: Amend the program by opening it up to all residential properties by removing the three (3) year longevity period AND extending eligibility to commercial properties as well, not including places of worship. Further, the amount allocated for the program would be restricted to no more than 30% disbursed towards commercial properties unless otherwise authorized by the City Council.

You will find that there are two separate resolutions as part of this agenda item addressing both options. The Council essentially has three choices – it may elect to make no changes at the meeting; it may choose to adopt the first option by resolution; or it may choose to adopt the second option by resolution. The Council will simply need to clearly state which Resolution it is willing to approve at the meeting, should you wish to do so.

CITY OF HUMBLE DOWNTOWN IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

General

The City Council of the City of Humble has determined that adopting a downtown improvement program benefits its citizens and the wellbeing of the general public by encouraging and securing residences within a defined area to improve and increase their stability, improvement and overall quality. The City of Humble (“City”) desires to enhance and promote its downtown area through this matching grant program designed to visually improve and beautify the exterior appearances of property and buildings within a defined geographical area.

The City intends to budget a certain amount annually to be disbursed in accordance with these guidelines. The City Manager or his designee (“City Manager”) shall administer this program in a manner consistent with the criteria set forth herein.

Eligibility

Eligibility requirements include the following:

1. Location. The applicant is a residence, not including commercial businesses or places of worship located within a geographic area bounded more or less by Rail Road Avenue to the West, Fisher Rd to the South, S. Houston Avenue to the East and 7th Street to the North as further depicted on a map attached herto as Exhibit “A.” The City Manager reserves the right to review, accept and approve applications received from properties immediately adjacent to this area.
2. Type of Improvement. The nature of the proposed improvement should be viewable from a public right of way or otherwise enhance the overall outward appearance of the property, and may include the following or similar type improvements as determined by the City Manager to meet the general provisions of these guidelines:
 - a. Building improvements such as

- i. façade improvements to a building on the property such as significant cleaning, restoration or new masonry or other form of building finish;
 - ii. Awnings;
 - iii. Window and door replacement or modification;
 - iv. New or restored detail elements such as cornices, soffits, canopies or similar details;
 - b. Property improvements such as
 - i. Sidewalks, outdoor furniture, railing and other appropriate pedestrian friendly amenities;
 - ii. Outdoor lighting;
 - iii. Parking lot or driveway development, improvement, resurfacing and striping;
 - iv. Fencing;
 - c. Removal of debris, dilapidated structure, demolition, etc.
- 3. Authorization. The applicant must be the owner of all the property towards which the grant relates.
- 4. Good Standing. The applicant and the property must be in good standing with the City, current on all monies due the City and not involved in a lawsuit or other legal actions against the City.
- 5. Cash Expenditures. Only applicant's actual cash expenditures may be used as a grant match to receive City funds but in kind services may be considered for applicant's match.

Not Eligible

The following are not eligible under this program:

- 1. Signs. Signs or improvements to signs unless falling under a category of approved improvements, such as an awning that has a company logo.
- 2. Landscaping. Such as shrubs, ground covers, palms, landscape lighting, rocks, pebbles, sand and irrigation systems.
- 3. Non-permanent. Annual flowers and other nonpermanent or nondurable improvements to the property.

4. False Information. Misleading or false information provided by the applicant to the City which formed the basis of approval.
5. Change. A change as to the status of the property, the project or the applicant such that the project no longer meets the guidelines.
6. Maintenance. Routine maintenance.
7. Legal action. Any project or property that is the subject of an interim action or other legal proceeding that unreasonably jeopardizes the purpose of the grant in the judgment of the City Manager.
8. Properties that have been awarded a previous Improvement Program Grant from the City of Humble.

If approval of an application was made and subsequent to such approval one or more of the above occurs before the project is complete and application for reimbursement is made, such reimbursement may be denied.

Funding

1. Amount. Qualifying applicants may be approved for a matching grant to a maximum amount of \$10,000 plus reimbursement of some or all City permit fees relating to the project.
2. Budget. Each year the City Council may allocate monies to this program, and the total amount of grants may be limited to this allocation.
3. Disbursement. The funds will be disbursed by the City Manager in accordance with these guidelines who will approve projects on a case by case basis.

Criteria for Granting

1. General. Criteria for granting funding under this program will be based upon availability of funds, capability of applicant to perform, visual impact, economic impact and other relevant factors.
2. Visual Impact. Factors affecting visual impact include the amount of improvement in the attractiveness of the property, the level of blight or deterioration removed, tastefulness and/or compatibility with surrounding properties, level of impact on overall appearance of the property and the productive life of improvements.

3. Economic Impact. Factors affecting economic impact include the amount of additional funding expended by the applicant, appropriateness of the residential improvement to the overall economic development in the area, mitigation of health and safety issues, and reuse of vacant or underutilized property.
4. City Manager. The City Manager has utmost discretion and makes all decisions with regard to the approval or disapproval of applications. By submitting an application, applicants accept that the decisions of the City Manager may involve subjective judgment and that all determinations by the City Manager are final.

Procedure

A summary of the procedure is as follows:

1. Application. An application must be made on a form provided by the City, must conform to all requirements set forth in the application, and the completed application submitted to the City Manager.
2. Contract. If the application is approved by the City Manager under this program, the applicant will be asked to enter into a contract on a form prescribed by the City. The City reserves the right to award an applicant a grant with certain additional provisions, conditions, or other requirements and may waive certain requirements as the City Manager determines appropriate and in keeping with these Guidelines.
3. Project. The project is undertaken by applicant. The City has the right to inspect the property throughout the duration of the project during reasonable times and conditions, and may require an inspection before reimbursement.
4. Reimbursement. Upon satisfactory proof that the project has been successfully completed as determined by the City Manager, applicant receives reimbursement.

Notice

1. **The provision or delivery of these guidelines to an interested party does not constitute nor create an offer of improvement grant, a property right, a contract, or other legal right requiring the City to provide funding.**
2. **The adoption of these guidelines does not limit the discretion of the City to decide whether to provide or not provide a grant to an applicant, which absolute right of discretion the City reserves unto itself, whether or not such discretion may be deemed arbitrary or without basis in fact.**
3. **The City, its employees, and its agents do not attest to the quality, safety, or construction of a project eligible for, or receiving grant funding and shall be held harmless by the applicant/applicants for any and all damages associated with the planning, construction, and subsequent existence of any project whose application has been approved, or has received actual grant funding.**

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

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") entered into by and between the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas ("Subsidence District") and Humble, City of, also a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas ("Sponsor").

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS , the Subsidence District is the regulatory agency responsible for preventing subsidence through reduction of groundwater withdrawals, governed by Chapter 8801, Special District Local Laws Code, which specifically provides that the Subsidence District may cooperate with "any local government to establish water conservation goals, guidelines, and plans to be used within the district"; and

WHEREAS, the Subsidence District cannot achieve water conservation goals without the cooperation and assistance of the public water supply systems; and

WHEREAS, the Subsidence District has designed a project to achieve water conservation through the retrofit of plumbing fixtures combined with a strong educational component administered through the public schools; and

WHEREAS, this project, "Learning to be Water Wise" has been tested in several area schools; and

WHEREAS, the plumbing retrofit devices used as part of this Project have been tested in the Municipal Utility District No. 55 Project, jointly sponsored by that District, the Texas Water Development Board, and the Subsidence District, and have demonstrated an average savings of 1,400 gallons of water per month; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor is also dedicated to conserving water supplies and providing outstanding service to their customers and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS , the governing bodies of the Subsidence District and the Sponsor have duly authorized this Agreement; and

WHEREAS , this Agreement is made pursuant to Chapter 791, Tex. Gov. Code, the Interlocal Cooperation Act;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and representations herein contained, the parties hereby agree as follows:

I.

PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

1.01 The Subsidence District will coordinate the Project by doing the following tasks:

(A) Purchase and distribute the school curriculum kits, including the teacher's guide, teaching aids, and plumbing retrofit kits.

(B) Provide in-service training to teachers and provide all support functions such as slide presentations, video presentations, publications, and program outlines.

(C) Conduct an evaluation of the program, collecting and analyzing evaluation forms from teachers, students, administrators and parents, and provide the evaluation results to the Sponsor.

(D) Provide all necessary documentation to the Texas Education Agency, Texas Water Development Board, and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

1.02 The Subsidence District will maintain a Groundwater Bank and shall provide water conservation credits as follows:

(A) The Sponsor shall receive a Certificate of Deposit water conservation credit equal to 84,000 gallons of groundwater (which equals 1,400 gallons per month for five years) for each student sponsored.

(B) The Sponsor may hold, transfer, sell, or redeem the Certificates of Deposit at any time, provided however, that the Certificates of Deposit will be honored by the District for no longer than 20 years after the date the Certificate of Deposit is issued.

(C) Redemption of the Certificate of Deposit requires the Subsidence District to increase the redeemer's groundwater allocation by the amount of the water conservation credit, provided however, that Certificates of Deposit issued beginning with the 2001-2002 school year (Series B) may only be applied to a maximum of 30% of the permittee's total water demand. This absolute right to increase the groundwater allocation by up to 30% of the permittee's total water demand does not in any way affect the other terms and conditions of the groundwater permit and all groundwater withdrawals will be subject to the permit fees and other rules of the District in effect at the time of the permit.

1.03 The Subsidence District shall perform all coordination activities without charge to the Sponsor. The Sponsor may assist in any coordination activities and may participate in any phase of the Project at its own discretion.

II.

PAYMENT

2.01 The sponsor agrees to sponsor 200 Humble ISD students, including students at the following campuses which had a total 2014-2015 4th/5th grade enrollment of 179.

Humble Elementary and Lakeland Elementary

2.02 The Sponsor hereby agrees to pay to the Subsidence District, promptly upon receipt of an invoice from the Subsidence District, the total amount due, which is equal to \$35.40 per student sponsored. The above payment shall provide sponsorship for the above listed school(s) for one year. The amount of the invoice shall be calculated using the actual enrollment in the named schools for each year of the Project.

2.03 From time-to-time the Sponsor may seek to adjust the number of students sponsored by providing a written request to the Subsidence District, subject to the availability of schools willing to participate in the project.

2.04 The Sponsor agrees to pay a similar amount, adjusted for the actual cost of the sponsorship kit and the number of students sponsored, each year for the term of this Agreement.

2.05 This cost represents the sole monetary obligation of the Sponsor in exchange for and in consideration of the Subsidence District's obligations hereunder.

III.

TERM AND TERMINATION

3.01 The term of this Agreement shall be from the effective date hereof until termination of the 2015-2016 school year. This agreement may be renewed annually with written authorization of the Sponsor and approval of that authorization by the General Manager of the Subsidence District.

3.02 The Certificates of Deposit in the Groundwater Bank shall be transferred to the custody of the Sponsor upon receipt of payment from sponsor, and shall be honored by the Subsidence District for no longer than 20 years after the date the Certificate of Deposit is issued.

IV.

MISCELLANEOUS

4.01 Subsidence District is engaged as an independent contractor, and all of the services provided for herein shall be accomplished by Subsidence District in such capacity. The Sponsor will have no control or supervisory powers as to the detailed manner or method of the Subsidence District's performance of the subject matter of this Agreement. All personnel supplied or used by the Subsidence District shall be deemed employees or subcontractors of the Subsidence District and will not be considered employees, agents or subcontractors of the Sponsor for any purpose whatsoever.

4.02 Each party to the contract is paying for the performance of the contract from current revenues and will pay for each subsequent year this agreement continues from the revenues budget for that year. The parties agree that each party is paying fair compensation for the services or products rendered.

4.03 This Agreement merges the prior negotiations and understandings of the parties hereto and embodies the entire agreement of the parties, and there are not other agreements, assurances, conditions, covenants (expressed or implied) or other terms with respect to the Project, whether written or verbal, antecedent or contemporaneous with the execution hereof.

4.04 The Subsidence District shall not assign or delegate any portion of its performance under this Agreement without the written consent of the Sponsor.

4.05 The Subsidence District shall remain obligated under all clauses of this Agreement that expressly or by their nature extend beyond the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including the obligation to honor Certificates of Deposit in the Groundwater Bank as provided in Section 1.02.

As discussed, ARKK Engineering is requesting an amendment to the existing contract for performing additional roadway, utility and, signal design at requested locations for work to be added to the design of the Concrete and Asphalt Pavement Improvement Projects.

The additional design consist of left turn and right turn lanes on Townsen West, paving, drainage and water line along Spring Creek Crossing to serve a proposed development along Townsen West. The paving improvements will include installing a traffic signal at the intersection of Spring Creek Crossing and Townsen West.

The additional design also consists of replacing Main Street from S. Houston Ave. to Davis Street. This work will consist of replacing with roadway with concrete pavement, replacing the water line and drainage improvements.




